In fact, there is no rule or standard recipe to make one. You can play around with the ingredients and layer it up in whichever way you want. As per Wikipedia the oldest known recipe of parfait dates back to 1892. Needless to say, this is something that has truly passed the test of time.

Do try it for breakfast or as dessert and add a refreshing touch to your day!

Recipe

Preparation Time: 15-20 minutes | Makes around: Two large dessert glasses/bowls Ingredients: Hung curd :200 gms | Fresh strawberries: 14-16 | Jaggery powder: 5-6 tbsp | Soaked chia seeds: 4 tbsp | Any muesli/granola: 4 tbsp | Parsley or Mint leaves to garnish

Procedure

1. Keep all the ingredients ready.

2. First prepare some fresh strawberry compote using around 8-9 (or as much you want)

strawberries and jaggery powder by placing the sliced berries in a thick bottomed wok/pan. Add jaggery powder on top of it and let it cook, stirring continuously till you get a jam like consistency. Turn off the flame and let it cool for some time. 3. Chop and slice the remaining strawberries in the meantime.

4. Once, the strawberry compote is cool enough, take out a dessert glass/jar/bowl and arrange all the ingredients, i.e., muesli/granola, hung curd, soaked chia seeds, strawberry compote, strawberry slices, chopped strawberries in layers one after the other. Garnish with mint/parsley leaves and it's done!



Inox Leisure commences operations in Thane



ultiplex operator Inox Leisure has commenced commercial operations of cinema in Thane with effect from January 26, 2021. The company has kick started operations at a new multiplex in the city taking its total count to 151.

The new multiplex has four screens and 240 seats. Inox is now present in 69 cities with 151 multiplexes, 641 screens and a total seating

capacity of 1,46,320 seats across India. Currently, multiplexes and cinema halls are operating under half of their sitting capacity in

accordance with the Unlock 5 guidelines issued by the government following COVID-19. Multiplexes and cinema halls were closed for almost seven months and opened in October last year. They are currently operating within the framework of a set of standard operating procedures.

Kalwa bridge connecting Thane and Navi Mumbai will be completed by June 2021

he pandemic induced lockdown had hit the work on the third Kalwa Creek bridge. Finally, after many months, the work was resumed. The Thane Municipal Corporation (TMC) conducted a trial of girder launch on the creek on February 7 and claimed that 80% of the work is

completed. The girder over the creek will be launched in one month while the entire work will be completed by June this year.

The bridge was supposed to open last monsoon, however the work was stalled due to the lockdown as labour was not available. The budget allocation for the bridge this year is D20 crore. The bridge is an important link connecting Thane and Navi Mumbai, and will ease the traffic congestion between the two cities along with congestion in Kalwa and Thane city areas. A number of residents from Thane take the bridge to reach various IT sector companies in Navi Mumbai.

Singhania school's four projects enter the national round of National Children's Science Congress

hane district saw the highest number of projects from the state being selected for the national round of National Children's Science Congress as out of 30 projects selected from the state, 10 were from Thane district.

It was seen that earlier 18 projects from the district were selected for the state round out of which 10 were chosen for the national round. The topic of this year's NCSC was 'science for sustainable living' and the selection round for nationals was from January 29 to January 31.

From Pune to Burj Khalifa



e always dreamt of being an entrepreneur. Seeing his grandfather blossom into a successful businessman, his desire to become rich and prosperous became stronger. "I vividly recall my childhood days when my grandfather used to drop me to school in his Mercedes. I was looked upon with awe in the school, thanks to the luxurious car. It was around that time, I made up my mind to become a successful

entrepreneur like my grandfather. He was the Chairman of Gultekdi Market Yard, which was Asia's largest vegetable market then, and he owned three wine shops as well," reminisces Mayur Ghule, a boy from Pune, who is now a proud owner of an office in the world's tallest building.

In his quest to make it big in life, Mayur went abroad to pursue his Masters in International Finance. He stood second in his University and through campus placement bagged a job with OPEC (Oil Producing and Exporting Council). During his Masters, he interned with Goldman Sachs, which turned out to be a life changing experience. "Till that time, I had no idea how the finance world works. The first two months were really tough. Slowly and steadily I started finding feet. I made good connections there and I am still in touch with my colleagues," he says. Free treatment at newly opened heart ailment centre in Thane for low income group



here is seldom any doubt that paying for heart ailments burns a hole in the pockets of the family members of the patient. While the middle and upper middle income group can somehow manage, the low income group suffers the most, since they do not have much savings. Additionally, people of Thane, who have modest incomes, would also travel to Mumbai to get the best possible treatment. In view of this, Thane Municipal Corporation (TMC) has shot two birds in one bullet. The civic body has come up with a heart ailment centre in Thane that will provide free of cost treatment to people belonging to the low income group.

The civic body through PPP (public private partnership) model started Dharmaveer Anand Dighe heart ailment treatment centre at Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj (CSM) Hospital in Kalwa. The centre was inaugurated by guardian minister Eknath Shinde on January 27.

Prior to this, it is known that the city had no centre in any government hospital here wherein heart ailments could be treated. The patients were asked to go to hospitals in Mumbai for heart related treatments. A t this newly opened centre at CSM hospital one can undergo angioplasty, angiography, putting stent etc. The resolution against the centre was passed in 2018. It is learnt that while the treatment at the centre is free for people from low income groups, others can avail the facility at a discounted rate. People had to shell out huge amounts in order to just get treated for heart ailments as there was no such facility in a civic hospital in the city. This centre will help the people especially those in low income groups as the facility for them is free of charge.

Thane cops warn citizens against shopping on social media

The Thane city police has issued an advisory urging people to be cautious while shopping online on social media platforms like Facebook and Instagram.

Cops stated that several retail pages have cropped up on both of these social media sites, and among other products, some of them also sell mobile phones, laptops, cameras and watches. These pages generally tend to offer allegedly branded items at a much lower cost, thus attracting potential buyers towards them.

They then provide the customers with a payment link or ask them to pay the discounted price via UPI platforms such as GooglePay and PhonePe, and successfully dupe them of huge amounts of money.

The number of such cases has increased in the recent past, according to the city police. In the past few months, the number of online frauds and scams has seen a dramatic surge in Thane, Mumbai and other MMR (Mumbai Metropolitan Region) areas. Recently, a 32-year-old man was arrested for cheating around 22,000 people, especially women for over Rs 70 lakhs, under the pretence of online shopping.

The advisory warned people to be careful while interacting with such pages and websites and asked them to not resort to online transactions in such cases.



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
