Know Your Ingredient Pumpkin

Here's a recipe for pumpkin soup. Hope you enjoy it!

- Preparation time: 20 minutes
- Serves: 4 people

Ingredients:

- 250 gms pumpkin
- Sliced onions- 1 cup
- Olive oil- 3 tbsp
- Water- 3 cups
- Bay leaf-2
- Star anise-2
- Cumin/Jeera- ½ tsp
- Turmeric powder- 1 tsp
- Black pepper powder- 1 tsp
- Garam masala- ¼ tsp (optional)
- Nutmeg powder- ¼ tsp
- Salt to taste
- Grated cottage cheese/paneer- ¼ cup
- Fresh parsley- few sprigs
- Pumpkin seeds- 2-3 tbsp
- Roasted walnuts- 6-8 (optional)





Procedure

- 1. Keep all the ingredients ready.
- 2. Chop pumpkin into medium sized cubes.
- 3. Heat oil in a wok. Add bay leaf, star anise, cumin, and sliced onions to it.

4. Sauté onions till they are caramelised or turn golden brown.

5. Add Pumpkin, turmeric powder, garam masala and water. Cook till the pumpkin is tender.

6. Blend everything in a mixer to make a puree.

7. Transfer the puree to the wok and heat it again. Add more water if needed to adjust the consistency. Add pepper powder, nutmeg powder, salt and give it a good stir.

8. Remove from heat, transfer to soup bowls and garnish with grated cottage cheese, parsley, pumpkin seeds and roasted walnuts. Enjoy hot with toasted bread or steamed rice.

IT'S NOT HOW, BUT WHOM THAT MATTERS!

he upcoming election of the Thane Municipal Corporation (TMC) scheduled for next year has become the talk of the town, more particularly among politicians over the mode of contest. The civic body has been asked to conduct the election on the basis of multiple candidates per ward, popularly known as panel system. The 133 wards of the TMC shall be divided into 43 wards, each represented by three corporators and the last one will have four candidates to make up the total. Given that the present house of the civic body was elected by the panel system which had four corporators per ward, the hue and cry around it is unfounded.

The debate started after Congress objected to the three member system and harped on two corporators per ward. The Shiv Sena which holds the sway in the TMC and the Nationalist Congress Party which is close on the heels as far as the power distribution is concerned are okay with the state cabinet's decision, however the BJP has cleverly refrained from participating in the controversy. The latter perhaps feels that the bickering in the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) will help their bigger design of bringing down the government. However this is far from the wishful thinking of the BJP as the MVA will not stretch the issue beyond reconciliation. The stand taken by the state Congress committee is intriguing as it should have either quashed the proposal in toto or pressed for a one to one contest, as the multi-candidate system will apparently not serve their interests at all. This was the general feeling

of the party corporators who are fast diminishing in numbers and are on the last slot in the party equation chart.

The multi-candidate system has many inherent disadvantages from the voters' point of view but actually suits the plans of the political parties. The system insulates the parties who have a weak organisational set up as the candidates can overcome their limitations and leverage their success by relying on the better counterparts in their panel. However, given to understand that fighting elections is a luxury and those cash strapped do not dare enter the fray despite having the actual elective merit, they have to find crutches to emerge victorious. Similarly the otherwise `bad` candidates opt for such deserving candidates and make way in the house where they are known for their non-performance. In a one to one contest it is the quality of the candidate and his party who are put to an acid test and make them more accountable to the electorate. The panel system actually dilutes the sanctity of the election process. It must be noted that the system was challenged in the courts too.

Elections by any mode must ensure that the elected representatives live up to the expectation of the people. The general public is least bothered about the modalities and hope that their basic amenities are served without hassles. For them, who rules the roost and whose flag unfurls from the corporation building are trivial issues and gutter-meter-water become deciding factors!

Fifth and sixth railway line of Diva-Thane will be completed by February 2022: Dr. Shrikant Shinde

ast month, Dr. Shrikant Shinde, LokSabha MP of Kalyan constituency, inspected the on-going work with officials from Central Railway and Mumbai Railway Vikas Corporation (MRVC). The fifth and the sixth line which is pending between Thane and Diva will segregate express trains and local services on the Central railway between CST and Kalyan. The work was started in 2008. After 13 years, the work remains incomplete. Dr.Shinde held a meeting with MRVC and Central railway officials and travelled between Mumbra to Kopar railway station to inspect the work of the fifth and sixth lane. Additionally, he took a stock of the work being carried out at Kopar, Vithalwadi and Ambernath railway stations.

Dr. Shinde has assured that despite the work going on for 13 years, it is in the final stages. He also gave a tentative deadline for the completion of the work which stands at February 2022. With the completion of the fifth and sixth railway lanes, 25-30 additional local trains will run between Kalyan and CST. Earlier, trains used to be stranded behind an express train due to dearth of separate railway tracks. The new lanes will offer two lanes for fast trains, two for slow trains and two for express trains due to which trains will not be delayed.

Earlier, there were railway crossings at Thakurli, Ambivali, Diva and Kalwa Kharegaon on the railway line. Railway crossing at Thakurli and Ambivali has been closed and bridges are built there. The Kharegaon railway crossing will also

be closed in the next two months after the completion of the railway flyover at Kharegaon. It is also known that the home platform work on Kopar railway station will be completed by the end of this month after which it will be opened for passengers.

10 unexplored destinations to visit in Maharashtra right now

With the pandemic not yet over (though slowly receding) and the travel bug biting some of us, safety is our first priority while chalking out a getaway. Popular destinations are often milling with crowds, and hence seem relatively less safe. However, there are a host of options that you can explore without worrying (too much) about safety and sanitization.Below are 10 handpicked and unexplored destinations in Maharashtra that you can check out:



1. Lonar

Tucked away in a remote part of Aurangabad, Lonar gets its name from the eponymous lake which was created when a meteorite hit earth. The lake is 6,000 sqft and surrounded by ancient temples.

2. Vikramgad

A small village near Palghar, Vikramgad is best known as the place of origin of Warli paintings. There are multiple nature trails and eco-friendly stays in the area. One can hike to the PiluchaDhabdhaba Waterfalls or have a private picnic in the forest.

3. Chikhaldara

Located in Amravati, Chikhaldara is known for the Melghat Tiger Reserve, multiple forts which one can trek to, waterfalls and coffee cultivation. There are also lakes and temples that one can visit.

4. Tamhini Ghat

Located in Pune, this ghat is surrounded by dense woods and deep valleys which make it a favourite with trekkers, campers and hikers. One can also plan a day-long road-trip, as Tamhini is nestled in the Western Ghats between Mulshi and Kolad.

5. Amboli

Amboli is at an altitude of 690m. The hill station is relatively remote - and unexplored. It boasts of picturesque streams, waterfalls, and forts.

6. Dapoli

For those who love sun-soaked beaches, Dapoli, located in Ratnagiri, is a must-visit. There are a whole bunch of water sports you can try at the numerous beaches in this coastal town. There are also historic forts. caves, and temples to explore.

7. Guhagar

The eponymous beach in Guhagar happens to be one of the cleanest and least polluted beaches in Maharashtra. You can enjoy some really wonderful non-vegetarian food, read a book, enjoy the solitude and quiet and stroll by the beach, if that's your cup of tea.

8. Sandhan Vallev

While there aren't any conventional stay options around there, if you are up for a camping trip, Sandhan Valley is just the perfect spot. Surrounded by the Konkankada, there are a number of adventure activities such as rappelling and trekking to do.

9. Pali

Known for the Ganesh temple in the area, Pali is otherwise a quiet destination for those seeking solitude. There are plenty of homestays, villas and farmhouses that one can book to explore the surrounding hills, waterfalls and nature trails in the town.

10. Panhala

Another little-known hill station in Maharashtra, Panhala, in Kolhapur, is best known for its historical fort from the Shivaji era. It is the smallest city in Maharashtra and has a cool climate throughout the year, making a trek to the fort extremely pleasant and worthwhile.

Thane will get an internal metro to connect to Metro Line 4

During a general body meeting that was held in the Thane Municipal Corporation (TMC) in the first week of September, it was unanimously decided to scrap the proposed Light Rail Transit system and instead build a conventional metro line as an internal transportation system for the city.

At present, metro line 4 from Wadala to Kasarvadavli-Gaimukh, is under construction. The civic body, however, felt that it also needed an internal metro to connect various parts of the



city to this metro line. Subsequently, a DPR (detailed project report) of the entire project was prepared by Maha Metro. However, the central government instructed TMC to implement a Light Rail Transit (LRT) project as it would be more cost efficient. Having a different opinion, the Maharashtra government stalled the LRT proposal and stated that in view of Thane's growing population, the metro would be better than the LRT, since the former can carry more passengers.

The cost of the internal metro project is expected to be Rs 10,000 crore. The central and state governments will each provide 16.65 per cent of the funds for the internal metro project, and the remaining funds will have to be made available by TMC with lowinterest loans.

Thane district's Bhatsa dam has 99.5% useful water content

ater shortage is unlikely to be an issue going forward atleast for a few months. The seven lakes, namely, Tulsi, Vihar, Bhatsa, Tansa, Middle Vaitrana, Upper Vaitarna and Modak Sagar, that provide water to Mumbai city are now 99.2% full. In 2020, these lakes were 98.2% full and in 2019, they were 97.8% full. This indicates that the lakes have seen a 1% and 1.4% points increase in water levels from their 2020 and 2019 levels respectively. Water reserves near-full capacity means there will be sufficient quantities to meet the city's water requirements throughout the year and residents are unlikely to face any water crisis.

Mumbai city that receives its drinking water supply from the aforementioned seven lakes have a total water capacity of 1,447,363 Million Litres (M Litres). They are



located in Mumbai, and the neighbouring Thane and Palghar districts. Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) supplies 3,850 M Litres of water to Mumbai per day. The seven lakes are bifurcated into two systems- the Vaitarna system supplies water to the western suburbs and the Island city, and the Bhatsa system that provides water to the eastern suburbs.

Four out of the seven lakes, namely, Tulsi, Vihar, Tansa, and Modak Sagar have already overflown once this monsoon, in July. On September 13, BMC began to release water from Upper Vaitarna also, which currently has 99.3% water, as per BMC data. Water-level in Tulsi and Vihar lakes is full at 100%, while it is almost full at 99.14% for Tansa and 99.9% for Modak Sagar.

Bhatsa dam in Thane district has 99.5% useful water content. Of its total capacity of 717,037 M Litre, 575,700 M Litre are allotted to Mumbai for use, and comprise over 40% of the annual water requirement of the city. Middle Vaitarna has 97.44% useful water content.

Thane's Civil Hospital gets super-specialty status

Thane's Civil Hospital has been granted a super-specialty status, which indicates that a massive upgrade in the hospital infrastructure and facilities is inevitable in the near future. Additionally, the state government has also given approval for a 200-bed special hospital for women and children, and another 200-bed super specialty hospital.

The Public Health Department has granted Thane civil hospital the status of a superspeciality hospital. The department has issued a Government Resolution (GR) and allowed an increase of 326 beds in the civil hospital, taking the total strength to 500. Presently, the hospital has around 174 beds.

The Thane civil hospital receives a



huge foot fall of patients from Thane and Palghar districts; several accident victims are also brought here. The revamp of the hospital was necessitated after complaints by locals that medical facilities in Thane were not at par with that of Mumbai, which compelled many residents to travel all the way to Mumbai for quality medical treatment. With the upgradation, the residents can avail quality treatment in their nearest hospital.

The upgradation proposal had got a major push when Thane district guardian minister Eknath Shinde was the health minister in the previous BJP-SS government. As per reports, Thane district collector Rajesh Narvekar said, "Part of a few structures will be removed and reconstructed. The existing civil hospital was built prior to independence, we needed a super-specialty hospital. The new project will cost us over Rs 500 crore."

Thane gets a Special Task Force to improve its pothole riddled roads

Potholes and dilapidated roads have led to many accidents over the years. Thane is not an anomaly as there have been several records of road accidents due to the menace of the potholes.

Cognizant of this, the residents of Thane took to social media to express their anger. They carried out several campaigns on social media so that the concerned authorities would pay heed to their demands. Taking note of the increasing anger among the residents of Thane, Thane district Guardian Minister Eknath Shinde conducted a meeting with Thane Collector, CP and other senior officials.

During the meeting between Shinde and bureaucrats, it was decided that a Special Task Force will be formed for coordinating among various agencies and resolving all road-related issues. The team will coordinate with five government agencies responsible for roads to ensure prompt redressal.

Amidst of this, it is also known that four engineers from the Thane Municipal



Corporation (TMC) have been suspended for failing to ensure quality of road works in the city. Minister Eknath Shinde warned that officials from other agencies including MMRDA, MSRDC and PWD will also not be spared. Three contractors responsible for executing poor-quality road works in Thane are likely to be blacklisted, as per reports.
