MORE THAN YES MINISTERS

ith the degradation of politics in the country reaching the bottom of minimum decency by every passing day thereby razing the so called temples of democracy in rubble, a pleasant surprise was delivered by two union ministers in their speeches which were par excellent. Apart from them being masterpieces of articulate public discourse, they carried a lot of content, sense and maturity that will make the common man rethink that politics is definitely not the last resort of scoundrels. It has scholars too and not those `Yes minister` bumbling kinds whom we find by dozens.

The first speech which impressed many like me, who look at politicians with a degree of caution, was made by union minister of road transport and highways Mr. Nitin Gadkari. Fondly described as `spiderman` of Indian politics, the attribute bestowed upon him for weaving a web of road through the length and breadth of the country, Mr. Gadkari is so well versed with his ministry that he seldom requires any notes to refer. 

TMC and Thane Traffic Police develop three morning walk plazas

ntending to make safe walkways for the enthusiastic morning walkers, Thane Traffic Police and the Thane Municipal Corporation (TMC) are developing three-morning walk plazas from April 1.

Last winter, the Thane Traffic Police had developed a similar concept of 'health corridors', which garnered a tremendous response. The three roads include Mayor Bungalow to Payladevi Temple, Veer Birsamunda Road to Dr. Kashinath Ghanekar Road, and Traffic Police Office in Teen Hath Naka to Dharamveer Anand Dighe Entrance. One lane for these three roads will be barricaded, beautified, and dedicated only for morning walkers from 5.30 am to 8am.

There have been chain snatching incidents early in the morning when most people are out for a jog or a walk. This concept will ensure that the residents can walk freely without the fear of accidents or chain snatchers. Vehicles will not be allowed on this lane. Traffic cops will be patrolling these lanes.



It is also known that the potholes will be filled, roads will be repaired and the lanes will be beautified. Yoga and aerobic sessions could be conducted on these three lanes in the future. Such places are the need of the hour. The majority of the people have been working from home for the last two years. People need such places for exercise and good health. These three lanes have been open since April 1.

First underground parking facility will be opened in Thane in May

Thane will get its first underground parking facility below the historic Gaondevi Maidan near Thane railway station. The underground parking facility will be opened in early May, as per the Thane Municipal Corporation (TMC) officials.

The 4330 square meter underground parking facility can house 250 vehicles, including 130 cars and 120 two-wheelers. Such a facility will ease the traffic near the Thane railway station premises caused due to the shortage of proper parking spaces.

The underground parking will be a paid parking facility and the corporation's first plaza near Thane station. The cost of the project is around ₹26Cr.

The facility is equipped with a car lift, passenger elevator, sufficient ventilation, fire



fighting equipment, and electric arrangements. The parking will have an entry point from Gaondevi temple while an exit from the scout and guide building. Apart from charging for hourly parking, the corporation also contemplates a monthly pass for night parking.

The Gaondevi ground is one of the few open spaces in the city. There was a lot of opposition

to developing the underground parking facility, fearing the

destruction of the ground. A few activists had approached the High Court seeking clarity on the corporation's plans to restore the ground to its earlier status.

As per the TMC officials, once the work of the parking facility is completed, they will restore the ground to its earlier status. Probably by monsoon, the ground will be restored. The parking is underground, so after the construction of parking, the soil will be backfilled over the top slab. It will be leveled with the existing ground level.

A section of Thane-Bhiwandi-Kalyan Metro to be underground

knath Shinde, state urban development minister, recently confirmed that a section of Metro Line 5 (Thane-Bhiwandi-Kalyan) running through Unnat Nagar in Bhiwandi will be taken underground. This is a very good decision on the part of the state government since it would save 735 buildings from being razed.

Shinde also mentioned that those displaced due to the project would be provided housing under the MMRDA rental housing scheme, while affected shop owners would also get 225 sq ft shops.

At present, the cost of the project is estimated to be Rs. 8,417 crore. However, the recent development to take a section of Metro Line 5 underground is expected to increase the cost of the project by an additional Rs. 400 crore.

Thane's real estate prices are slowly catching up with Mumbai's

How did this price gap bridge? It's a combination of factors:

1) Decentralization of economic activity: There was a time around two decades ago when all key economic activity presided primarily in South Bombay at locations like Fort, Nariman Point, etc. that ensured the surrounding areas fetched a steep premium whereas all the distant others languished. New business districts were later created elsewhere, bringing several other locations into consideration.

2) Connectivity: It is undeniable that infrastructure connectivity has been inadequate in the Mumbai Metropolitan Region (MMR). It is also equally undeniable that there has been a degree of improvement. That has meant the workforce is able to stay in distant areas and yet travel to their workplace.

3) Quality of projects: There is no market where top developers are slugging it out in the manner that is happening in Thane. The availability of large parcels of land has allowed developers to enter this market with competitive and credible offerings. Given the availability of land, almost every project offers social and recreational amenities like a swimming pool, gym, banquet hall, walking track and the like. Indeed, the choice for many has now come to mean a small apartment by a local developer with no amenities in Mumbai Living in the shadow of Mumbai for decades, Thane is slowly but steadily garnering popularity among the home buyers. In the recent development in the real estate market, it is known that the prices of the upcoming Oberoi project in Thane will match those of its Mulund project in Mumbai.

versus a bigger apartment by a branded developer with amenities in Thane.

4) Familiar surroundings: Housing is often local. There is no empirical data on this but it is believed that three-fourths of all demand for a new project is sourced from nearby areas. That means homebuyers will prefer to upgrade within their own locality than relocate into a different micromarket—even if the other micromarket is perceived as being more up-market.

5) Market being project-specific: There was a phase when the price gap between a good building and a not so good building on the same street was marginal. Location was everything. Today that phenomenon hardly exists. Projects matter. Hence, it's not uncommon to see the price gap between two buildings next to each other be as high as 25-30 percent. Quality offerings are able to demand a premium while poor projects are discounted.

6) Governance: It is no secret that civic amenities have been on a downward spiral in Mumbai over the last few decades. Governance has suffered with many homebuyers concluding that paying steep prices just to reside in 'Mumbai' is simply not a productive decision.

At a macro level, home prices in Thane have performed better than that of Mumbai in the last decade. According to data from real estate analytics firm Liases Foras, home prices in Thane were only 36 percent of the prices of Mumbai city in 2009-10. Since then, it has outperformed Mumbai. Yet even today rates in Thane are 50 percent of the rates in Mumbai.

Mumbai has an inherent economic strength that is hard to displace. But Thane will continue to gain and narrow the gap in property prices to Mumbai. The peak probably will be its rates reaching 55-60 percent that of Mumbai prices.

The game changer for several parts of the MMR was undoubtedly going to be the Mumbai Metro. Its integrated development had the potential to bring about sharp changes in prices across the board. Ever since progress on that has slowed, it is anyone's guess when the outcome would materialise.

What is certain is this: If Thane's administration raises its game, a future divorce battle will not be fought by making a sharp distinction between Thane and Mumbai.

India's happiness index better than only Afghanistan among South Asian nations

ast month, the United Nations Sustainable Development Solutions Network published the 10th edition of the World Happiness Report. While it was not at all surprising to see Finland topping the list for the fifth straight time, it was quite shocking to see India lagging behind some of its Asian counterparts like Nepal, Bangladesh, Pakistan and Sri Lanka.

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While some may celebrate India's three places jumping from 139 to 136, it is important to note that the country is behind the aforementioned neighbours by some margin. From the World Happiness Report it can be seen that Nepal is ranked 84th, Bangladesh 94th, Pakistan 121st and Sri Lanka 127th. Among the South Asian nations, only Talibanruled Afghanistan fared worse than India. Afghanistan was named the most unhappy country in the world, ranking last on the index of 146 countries. The Happiness report also stated that India was one among the countries that witnessed, over the past 10 years, a fall in life evaluations by more than a full point



on the 0 to 10 scale.

How is the happiness quotient evaluated by the United Nations Sustainable Development Solutions Network in the World Happiness Report? Factors such as GDP, social support, personal freedom, and levels of corruption in each nation are taken into account for measuring the levels of happiness. Finland, which topped the list, was followed by Denmark, Iceland, Switzerland, and the Netherlands. The United States, on the other hand, managed to bag the 16th position with Britain and France taking 17th and 20th ranks respectively.

The latest list was completed before the Russian invasion of Ukraine.

Kalyan's Sacred Heart School replants trees to save environment



S acred Heart School in Kalyan won many hearts as the school decided to work on the mission to save 20 trees that would be otherwise axed for widening the Kalyan-Murbad national highway. In a thoughtful move by the school to protect the environment, the concerned school authorities obtained



permission from the forest department, uprooted as many as 12 trees till March 22 and replanted them in the protected area of the forest department.

The National Highways Authority of India, which will be widening a portion of national highway number 61 (from Kalyan up to Murbad), has proposed to cut 450 trees on the stretch. Albin Anthony, chief operating officer of the Sacred Heart School confirmed that as a first step, the school has decided to save at least 20 trees by replanting them. Prior to this, it is known that the school has replanted trees earlier too on the said forest land.
